


Exporting references from PubMed® to EndNote®

References can be exported from PubMed into EndNote:

- [From the result list \(some or in bulk\)](#)
- [In the detailed record display \(one by one\)](#)
- [By using the Clipboard in PubMed](#)

From the result list



4. click 'Create File'

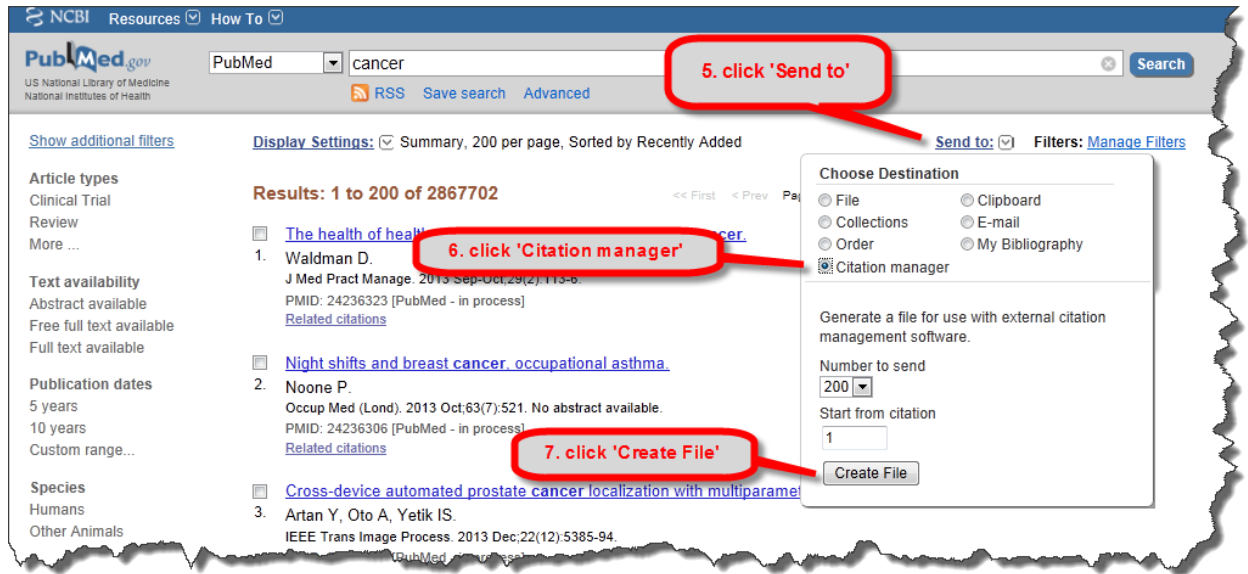

For **Bulk export (up to 200 references per download)** do **NOT** tick any reference boxes



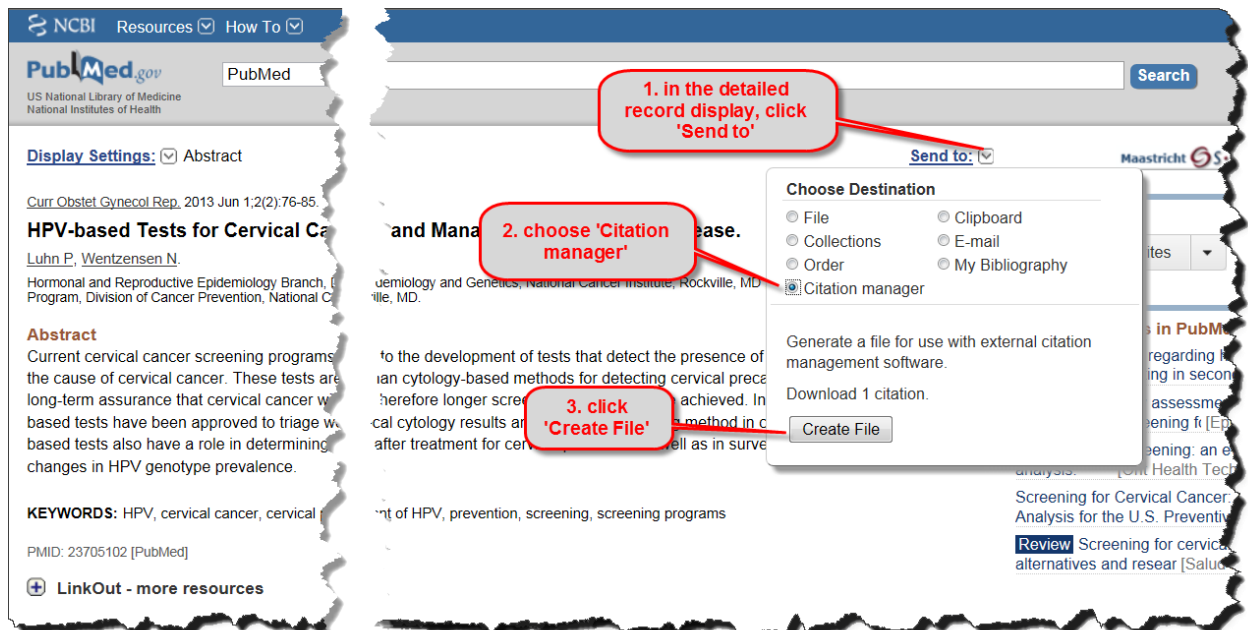

Using the clipboard in PubMed

1. tick boxes of references to import into EndNote

2. click 'Send to'

3. tick the 'Clipboard' box

4. click 'Add to Clipboard'

5. when finished adding references to the Clipboard, click '... items'
